Free 4thFEST Concert July 3: Three Bands, Three Times the Entertainment

The annual free 4thFEST concert on July 3 has become a Coralville Independence Day tradition, and the 2011 lineup promises to provide triple the excitement. Featuring an evening with Herman's Hermits starring Peter Noone, The Grass Roots, and Cedar Island Band, the free concert – which begins at 5:30 pm in S.T. Morrison Park on July 3 – echoes this year's 4thFEST theme, we're into something good!

Herman's Hermits Starring Peter Noone: 9:00 pm



Herman's Hermits starring Peter Noone will headline the 2011 free 4thFEST concert.

With over 80 million records sold and 20 top-20 hits, Herman's Hermits and Peter Noone are among rock and roll's most versatile entertainers. This English band's hits from the 1960s will strike a familiar chord, with *I'm Henry VIII, I Am*; *Mrs. Brown, You've Got a Lovely Daughter*; *There's a Kind of a Hush*; *Can't You Hear My Heartbeat*; and

I'm into Something Good among them. Noone has also had an active television career.

The Grass Roots: 7:30 pm

The Grass Roots set a record for being on the Billboard charts for 307 straight weeks, achieving one platinum and two gold albums, 13 gold singles, and charted singles a total of 29 times. Hits such as *Let's Live for Today*, *Baby Hold On*, *Temptation Eyes*, *Two Divided by Love*, and *Midnight Confessions* were a part of their late 1960s success and continuing appeal as an American rock band.



Cedar Island Band: 5:30 pm

Cedar Island Band, a six-piece tropical rock band based in Cedar Rapids with a strong regional following, will begin the night's entertainment at 5:30 pm with their mix of Jimmy Buffett, island, and tropical music. The band has played in six states and was nominated for the Margarita Mafia TropRock Horizon Award in 2009.

Coralville Welcomes RAGBRAI® for Overnight Stop on July 29

RAGBRAI®, the Register's Annual Great Bicycle Ride Across Iowa, is a seven day bicycle ride. Heading into its 39th year, RAGBRAI is the longest, largest, and oldest touring bicycle ride in the world.

Coralville will welcome nearly 20,000 bikers, support teams, and friends for an overnight stop on Friday, July 29. The day will feature 38 Special in concert presented by Two Rivers Bank & Trust, local bands and entertainment, food, and family activities.

The route enters Coralville from Oxford on I.W.V. Road and then to Camp Cardinal Road, which turns into 22nd Avenue, and follows 9th Street around to 8th Street where riders will enter "RAGBRAI Central," S.T. Morrison Park. Maps are available at www.coralvilleRAGBRAI.com.

Special RAGBRAI® Rules in Effect on July 29 & 30, 2011

Barry Bedford, Chief of Police

A special outdoor entertainment and vendor ordinance will be in effect for July 29 and 30, as there was with the previous three RAGBRAI visits in Coralville, to help create a fun and safe environment for riders, visitors, and the community. Citizens are encouraged to note ordinance highlights as they plan activities. Detailed information is available at Coralville City Hall and www.coralvilleRAGBRAI.com. Outdoor entertainment permits and vendor permits will be issued until July 1; the fee for each is \$400.

Outdoor Entertainment

Anyone providing outdoor entertainment in Coralville on July 29 and 30 will need an Outdoor Entertainment Permit from the Coralville Police Department, 319.248.1800.

"Outdoor entertainment" means playing a musical instrument or using sound equipment outdoors or for an audience outdoors (including sounds created in a public or private building) if audible from a public right-of-way.

Additional outdoor entertainment requirements include:

1. No sale or provision of glass bottled beverages will be allowed.
2. The volume of outdoor entertainment should be reasonable for the circumstances and location and is subject to the control of the Chief of Police.
3. Outdoor Entertainment Permit holders must have an on-duty uniformed bonded

security officer on the premises while the outdoor entertainment takes place.

4. Vendors who have an Outdoor Entertainment Permit will not need a separate vendor permit or a sound equipment permit.
5. All outdoor entertainment should end at 11:00 pm on July 29, 2011.

Vendors

Anyone wishing to sell food, beverage, or non-food items in Coralville on July 29 and 30 will need a Vendor Permit from Coralville City Hall, 319.248.1700.

Additional vendor requirements include:

1. Temporary locations for Vendor Permit holders will be determined by the Coralville RAGBRAI Executive Committee.
2. Vendor Permit holders must comply with the Iowa Department of Health and the Johnson County Department of Health rules and regulations.
3. Existing Coralville businesses will be exempt from the Vendor Permit requirements for their primary business location.
4. Other specific requirements have been established for outdoor sales of alcoholic beverages; please contact Police Chief Barry Bedford at 319.248.1800 for more information.

Adult Summer Reading Program



Initial Round of Flood Mitigation Projects Wrap Up



Iowa River Landing Wetland Park: wetland walkway

The four initial I-JOBS I flood mitigation projects are nearing completion. The project highlights and status for each includes:

- **1st Avenue Clear Creek Bridge** – features a new higher, wider bridge over Clear Creek to improve the ability to convey flood waters in Clear Creek. The new bridge has five traffic lanes and 10 foot wide sidewalks on both sides. This project was completed in May 2011.
- **1st Avenue Reconstruction – Clear Creek to 6th Street** – includes five traffic lanes, 10 foot

wide sidewalks on both sides, and street-scape improvements. This project will be completed in June 2011.

- **1st Avenue Corridor Flood Prevention** – involves earthen berms, a multiple use trail, and three storm water pump stations along the Iowa River from I-80 to the Marriott Hotel and Conference Center North Parking Ramp, from the south side of the Marriott Hotel and Conference Center to the Quarry Road/7th Street intersection, and at the north end of the Iowa River Power parking lot. This project was completed in May 2011.
- **I-JOBS Flood Protection and Iowa River Landing Wetlands Park Improvements** – features permanent and removable flood walls, wetlands walkway, multiple use trail, and comfort station along the east side of the Marriott Hotel and Conference Center. The flood walls and wetlands walkway improvements were completed in May 2011. The trail and comfort station improvements will be completed in the fall of 2011.

The Next Phase of Flood Mitigation Projects



I-JOBS II storm water improvements and Community Development Block Grants storm water pump stations

The I-JOBS I flood mitigation projects along the Iowa River and 1st Avenue are being completed. The next phase of flood mitigation projects, which will begin this summer, include:

- **I-JOBS II Storm Water Improvements** – construction of earthen berms, permanent flood walls, removable flood walls, and storm water collection system improvements along Clear Creek from Highway 6 to the CRANDIC Railroad, and Biscuit Creek from Clear Creek to north of 5th Street.
- **Community Development Block Grants Storm Water Pump Stations** – construction of two new storm water pump stations located along the north and south sides of Clear Creek at 3rd Avenue and the old Movie Galleries areas, as well as the upgrade of four existing storm water pump stations in this area.
- **CRANDIC Flood Mitigation Project** – flood improvements including raising the railroad tracks, and the addition of permanent walls, earthen berms, and removable flood walls along the Iowa River from the Vine Restaurant area on Highway 6 north to the north end of the Iowa River Power parking lot.

Iowa River Landing Developments

Have you noticed the construction of two concrete towers on the north side of 9th Street east of 1st Avenue? These are the elevator shafts for the University of Iowa Hospital and Clinics Ambulatory Care Clinic Facility (ACCF) being built in the Iowa River Landing (IRL). The clinic will open in the fall



of 2012 and will serve an estimated 300,000 patients per year when fully utilized.

Infrastructure projects to support the ACCF and additional developments will begin in the summer of 2011 and be completed in June 2012. These include:

- **IRL West Parking Structure** - a 750 space parking facility to serve both the ACCF and adjoining retail development.
- **IRL Public Infrastructure Improvements 2011** - streets and public and private infrastructure for the ACCF, IRL West Parking Structure, and adjoining retail developments.

Stay tuned for a number of anticipated announcements in the coming months regarding additional development projects in the Iowa River Landing.

Property Boundaries

Knowing your lot line location is important. Items such as swing sets, fire pits, benches, or other belongings must remain on your property. City property is marked with a City boundary post and placing items or lawn debris such as branches and yard clippings on City property is not allowed.

When items are found on City property,


staff informs the property owner closest to the issue with a time limit for removal. When it can't be determined who is abusing City property, a letter is sent to all the neighboring properties. If you notice a neighbor disposing of trash or lawn debris on City land, call the Parks Department at 319.248.1780.

The Best Place for Grass Clippings

During mowing season, always direct grass clippings towards your lawn and away from streets, driveways, and sidewalks. Growing grass benefits from all the nutrients found in lawn clippings. Clippings left on impervious surfaces are washed down the storm drain and into the closest creek or stream. Once there, nature works to decompose the grass clippings and while doing so depletes the oxygen in water which fish and plants need to survive. Keeping grass clippings out of the street is a simple step to help keep Iowa's waters clean and healthy.

Utility Bills Switch to Monthly Cycle

Effective July 1, customers who currently receive their City of Coralville utility bill on a bimonthly basis will begin receiving their Coralville utility bill once a month. This change will help to identify problems earlier, such as high usage, and notify residents so that appropriate actions can be taken. In addition, a monthly bill can be easier to remember.

The last water rate increase was in July 2008. The additional funds generated by the rate change will help fund future improvements to the water plant.
