FRY Fest Features Activities for All Ages

Friday, September 4

Launch Labor Day weekend with FRY Fest, a new event to be held each year on the Friday before the first Iowa home football game, named in honor of former University of Iowa football coach Hayden Fry. Friday, September 4 marks the inaugural FRY Fest, a celebration of all that is Hawkeye with numerous free family-friendly activities throughout the day.

Ceremony and Dedication

A dedication ceremony and street sign unveiling with Hayden Fry will take place at 10:00 am at the corner of 1st Avenue and E. 9th Street, when Coralville's 1st Avenue will be officially co-named Hayden Fry Way between Interstate 80 and Highway 6. Fry will be honored for his commitment to the community, impact upon the economic development of Coralville, dedication to charitable causes and services, and contribution to the University of Iowa football program.

Tradeshow, Activities, and More

Sports fans can immerse themselves in a sea of black and gold at the FRY Fest tradeshow from 11:00 am to 7:00 pm inside the Coralville Marriott Hotel and Conference Center. This one-of-a-kind Hawkeye showcase features licensed Hawkeye merchandise for purchase and includes appearances and autographs by former and current student-athletes and coaches, plus Iowa Children's Museum "Small Fry" activities, ongoing radio remotes, and more. Hayden Fry look-a-like and impression competitions at 3:30 pm, a free throw contest, "Green Grass and High Tides" Guitar Hero challenge, and door prizes throughout the day make this truly a unique event. Classic cars will line E. 9th Street from 9:00 am to 3:00 pm for the FRY Fest Show and Shine.

Those looking for a bit of Hawkeye history at the tradeshow will find it at 1:30 pm, when current and former Hawkeye broadcasters and sports personalities join Hayden for a memorable panel discussion. Two exhibits featuring photos of all people, pets, and places named Hayden are scheduled: one at the UI Athletics Hall of Fame from 10:00 am to 8:00 pm, and another from 10:00 am to 5:00 pm at the Johnson County Historical Society Museum.

Evening Activities

The excitement continues at 5:30 pm with a Hawkeye Pep Rally just off Quarry Road at the Iowa River Landing, kicked off by 143 motorcycles – one for each Hayden Fry victory – riding down E. 9th Street. Special appearances include Hayden Fry, the Iowa Cheerleaders and Dance Team, Herky, the Hawkeye Marching Band, Iowa Wrestling Coach Tom Brands, former student-athletes, and the 2009 Iowa Hall of Fame Class. The Flying Hayden Skydivers are scheduled to make a grand entrance at 6:15 pm. A large-scale outdoor ticketed concert featuring Jake Owen, The Outlaws, and headlining artist The Charlie Daniels Band will be held adjacent to the Coralville Marriott Hotel and Conference Center starting at 6:30 pm, with food and beverages available on site.

FRY Fest is open to the public and is sponsored by the City of Coralville, Iowa City/Coralville Area Convention and Visitors Bureau, and The University of Iowa. After an exciting day of black and gold, FRY Fest presents a dynamic concert experience on Friday, September 4 by bringing three major performances to Coralville on one extraordinary night. With the backdrop of the Iowa River Landing, the outdoor concert features performances by two-time CMT Award nominee Jake Owen, southern rock favorite The Outlaws, and Grammy Award-winning The Charlie Daniels Band. Food and beverages cap off a remarkable evening.

Opening act Jake Owen kicks off the concert at 6:30 pm. Concert-goers will get another dose of talent at 8:00 pm when The Outlaws take the stage. Projects Update

Youth Sports Complex Update

The first phase of construction at the Youth Sports Complex has been completed, including the rough grading, roadway and parking lots, utility placement, initial round of tree plantings, and temporary seeding. The second phase of construction began in July with placement of electrical and irrigation. Playing fields are currently being fine graded, with fencing and ball field construction taking place in August. The playing fields will be seeded in September, ensuring two growing seasons before play next May.

The Youth Sports Complex is located just north of Dempster Drive in Coralville. At a cost of \$5.4 million, the first phase includes five youth baseball/softball fields, three soccer fields, a playground, a building for concessions sales and restrooms, and maintenance buildings. The complex will be open for public use in May 2010.

First Avenue Trail, Country Club Drive to Oakdale Boulevard

Funds were awarded through the federal stimulus package to fill in a gap in the trail system along First Avenue. Funding of \$420,000 was secured to build the trail from Oakdale Boulevard to Country Club Drive along First Avenue, including a separate pedestrian and bicycle bridge over Muddy Creek. The project will be bid this fall and will be constructed in the spring of 2010.

Clear Creek Trail Phase IV, Part 2

This trail project has been completed and now connects the Highway 6 area at Clear Creek to Hawkeye Park Road, including a section under the railroad. This trail section was funded with a congressional allocation through Senator Tom Harkin at a project cost of \$513,000.

Clear Creek Trail Phase V, Part 1 and Clear Creek Trailhead at Camp Cardinal

Staff is working with the Iowa Department of Transportation to bid two additional sections of Clear Creek Trail and a trailhead for construction in 2010. A congressional allocation of \$800,000 from Senator Harkin will build 1,475 feet of trail from just west of 25th Avenue along James Street, going south and west along the creek, passing near the former mill race from a flouring mill. The trailhead at Camp Cardinal Boulevard and Clear Creek will include parking, restrooms, a picnic area, and an embark/debark point for small watercraft for Clear Creek.

Clear Creek Trail Phase V, Part 2

The project has been funded through the Federal Recreation Trails program with a grant of \$226,000. The total project will be \$344,000 with a 20 percent city match to the grant dollars. This piece will extend the Clear Creek Trail an additional 1,700 feet to the west, ending near Deer Creek Road.

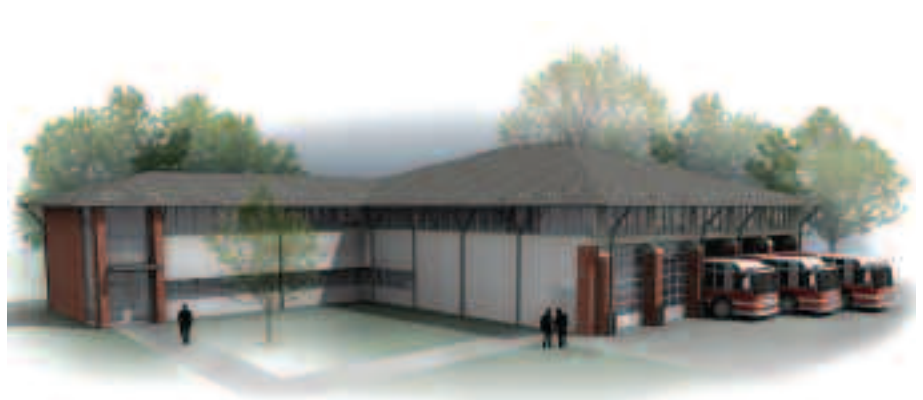

North Fire Station Nears Completion

Construction continues on Coralville's second fire station, located north of Holiday Road. The building will be completely enclosed by mid-August, followed by inside finish work, with a planned completion date of fall 2009. The Coralville North Fire Station will include a residency program for up to six student volunteer firefighters, in addition to ambulance space for Johnson County Ambulance Services. The location of the second fire station will decrease response time for the north side of the city. The current fire equipment and membership will be split between the two stations.

The Coralville Fire Department is accepting applications for membership for the next recruit class. Applications are accepted throughout the year and one academy class opens annually. The department currently seeks a large academy class to bring membership to the desired level of sixty. 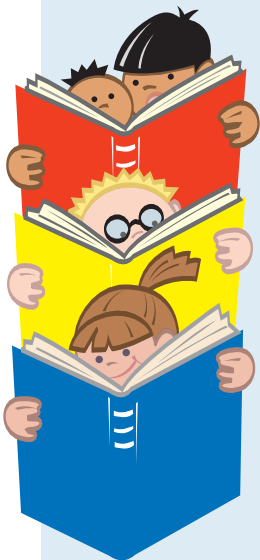

Community Fund Begins Grant Cycle

The Coralville Community Fund has begun its fourth annual grant cycle. The Fund is building an endowment to provide financial support for a broad range of charitable needs and community projects throughout Coralville, both now and in the future.

Grant applications are available at Coralville City Hall, Coralville Public Library, and <http://communityfoundationofjohnsoncounty.org/media/documents/grant-forms/CFJC-GrantApplicationForm.doc>

Applications for Coralville projects must be submitted by October 1. Grants will be awarded in January 2010.

The economic recession has negatively impacted local charitable programs and community projects and will continue to impact them in the coming months and years. This downturn demonstrates the importance of building a community endowment that can provide much needed support.

In its first three grant cycles, the Fund awarded nearly \$20,000 to a broad range of recipients, including the Coralville Public Library, Coralville Central PTO, Iowa Children's Museum, City Circle Acting Company of Coralville, Coralville Family Resource Center, Babe Ruth Baseball Organization, Johnson County Historical Society, Safety Village, Coralville Center for the Performing Arts, and others.

Contributions to the Endowment Fund in 2009 are fully deductible for Iowa and Federal income tax purposes. Endowment contributions are also eligible for a 20 percent Iowa income tax credit. This bonus is only available for endowment gifts to community foundations, and the Coralville Community Fund is an affiliate of the Community Foundation of Johnson County.

“Kneeling” Bus Added to Coralville Transit Fleet

In August a new 40' Gillig low-floor bus is scheduled to join the Coralville transit fleet, introducing new technology to the city's transit system. The new low floor model features “kneeling” capabilities to lower the bus closer to the curb as well as ramp access, making it easier to enter and exit the bus and eliminating the need for a lift. The bus will also be equipped with voice annunciation to notify passengers via GPS of upcoming stops.

Bus replacement is typically done through a federal program that provides discretionary funding of transit capital improvements, contributing 83% of the funds for a vehicle purchase, with the city matching the remaining 17%. Over the past several years, transit systems across the state have been forced to operate buses well past their useful life because of a shortfall in bus replacement funds. A heavy-duty transit bus typically has a useful life of twelve years, and currently Coralville is operating nine of its ten buses at or past their useful life. This spring, funds available through Congress and the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act were allocated to transit systems across Iowa for



buses in the Statewide Transportation Improvement Program, using a competitive ranking process based on the age and accumulated mileage of the vehicles being replaced.

It has been nearly a decade since the City of Coralville received funding to replace a fixed route bus in the transit fleet. In addition to the new low floor bus arriving in August, four new buses are scheduled to arrive in approximately one year. Coralville Transit currently provides service to Coralville, downtown Iowa City, and North Liberty.
