

## WHAT IS THE COMMUNITY POLICE ACADEMY?

The goal of the Community Police Academy is to promote a stronger relationship between law enforcement and the community it serves through education and hands-on learning.

The Community Police Academy will meet once a week for ten weeks for classroom and hands-on instruction. Additionally, each student will also have the opportunity to ride along with a patrol officer as they perform their duties. The ten weeks will conclude with a graduation ceremony.

The instructors are comprised of law enforcement officers and outside guest instructors who work on a daily basis in their area of instruction.

The forum for the Community Police Academy is not designed to stage a debate on police department policies, but rather to inform and answer questions community members might have.

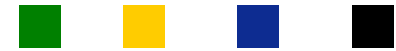

## **LAW ENFORCEMENT OATH**

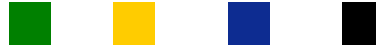
**On my honor, I will never betray my badge, my integrity, my character, or the public trust.**
